From Martin Luther King, Jr.'s principles of nonviolence:

Nonviolence seeks to defeat injustice, not people. Nonviolence willingly accepts the consequences of its acts.
Nonviolence holds that voluntary suffering can educate and transform. Unearned suffering is redemptive and has tremendous educational and transforming possibilities. Suffering can have the power to convert the enemy when reason fails.
Nonviolence chooses love instead of hate.
Nonviolence resists violence of the spirit as well as of the body. Nonviolent love gives willingly, knowing that the return might be hostility. Nonviolent love is active, not passive. Love for the enemy is how we demonstrate love for ourselves. Love restores community and resists injustice. Nonviolence recognizes the fact that all life is interrelated
