For God makes the sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your friends and family, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? You therefore must be perfect, as the Holy One is perfect.

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.
