COVID Advisory Group: Update

As an acknowledgement to the uptick in regional COVID cases, the COVID Advisory Group met this week. After some reflection and conversation, we decided that we simply want to reaffirm the health and safety suggestions we had previously adopted:

- 1. We believe that masks are a good way to protect wearers and help stop the spread of the disease. You are welcome to wear a mask to church, and we will make sure that masks and hand sanitizer are available in the narthex.
- 2. Our sanctuary is spacious! Feel free to spread out and practice social distancing.
- 3. New COVID boosters will soon be available, and we feel that boosters for COVID and other diseases like RSV, flu, and pneumonia offer good protection.

In addition, we use a fan each Sunday that filters the air in the sanctuary every twenty minutes. We will be purchasing air purifiers for the narthex and keeping the narthex doors open as long as the weather permits.

We thank you for the collaborative spirit of O.C.C. as we walk through a period of many unknowns. Thanks to your care for yourselves and each other, COVID has had a limited impact on our church population.

We hope to stay healthy and happy together!

All participants are members of our church who will be available to discuss their vehicle(s). There will be cars, bikes, and an electric cart. Come and see how our congregation is moving away from fossil fuel pollution to electric vehicles.

While you are at the show, pick up a handout about The Climate Center's program to urge Governor Newsom to sign SB 253, SB 261, and AB 1167 into law. SB 253 and SB 261 are about corporate accountability for the climate and AB 1167 would require the owners of orphaned and idle wells to properly close them to protect neighboring communities and the climate. The handout will have a link to write to the governor urging his signature on these bills.

October 22, after services, at 11:30 a.m., **Roger Samuelsen will lead a conversation about Common Hope**, an organization with which we have a long-time partnership. Each year, we bring together the funds to build a house, yes, a whole house! This will kick off our fundraising for this year's house.
