ELECTRIC VEHICLE SHOW SUCCESS!

A big thank you to all who participated in and to those who attended the Mercy & Justice Electric Vehicle Show last week. There were all-electric cars of various makes and models, an electric bike, and an electric cart. Our congregation is moving away from fossil fuel pollution to electric vehicles!

In our last eblast, Mercy & Justice asked members and friends to support the Climate Center's program to urge Governor Newsom to sign SB 253, SB 261, and AB 1167 into law. As soon as the announcement went out, word came that Governor Newsom signed all three bills. SB 253 and SB 261 are about corporate accountability for the climate and AB 1167 will require the owners of orphaned and idle wells to properly close them to protect neighboring communities and the climate.

Soon after, we received word that Interfaith Power and Light is promoting two other opportunities for advocacy. The first urged us to contact The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), which "has the opportunity to propose new federal Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) standards for vehicles sold in 2027 and beyond. Since they were established by Congress in 1975, these fuel economy standards have saved more than two trillion gallons of gasoline. Even as we move to electric vehicles, millions more gasoline powered vehicles will be sold in the coming decade. These gasoline vehicles must be as efficient as possible."
